The Atomic Energy Commission has announced that work has been started on a full-scale electric power plant to be run by atomic energy.

None of us, including the scientists, know at this time all that nuclear power can do for us. However, Thomas E. Murray, Atomic Energy Commissioner, has stated it is as important for this nation to stay ahead in the peacetime industrial race in nuclear power as it is for us to stockpile atomic bombs.

But, put private industry to work and it will do the job. As Commissioner Murray puts it, "I am convinced that such (Atomic Energy Commission) sponsoring and financing will fall short of what is needed unless there are enlisted in this cause the cost-cutting drives, the know-how, skills and competition of many segments of America's business and industry."

Let our object be our country, our whole country, and nothing but our country. And, by the blessing of God, may that country itself become a vast and splendid monument, not of oppression and terror, but of wisdom, of peace, and of liberty, upon which the world may gaze with admiration forever.
