

UCCA Representative — Principal Speaker at Bulgarian Commemoration in New York

NEW YORK.—Walter Dushnyck, editor of The Ukrainian Bulletin and Acting Editor of The Ukrainian Quarterly, both published by the Ukrainian Congress Committee of America, was the principal speaker at the Bulgarian American fete, on Saturday, May 23, 1959, at the Carnegie Endowment Building in New York City.

The program was opened by Dr. G. Obreschcow, president of the N.Y. Chapter of the American Bulgarian League, and included the addresses of George Danyanov, and G. Ribaroff, and the singing of Miss Penka Lamarr, noted Bulgarian-American soprano, who was accompanied by Mrs. D. Dikova.

Mr. Dushnyck spoke on the "Bulgarian-Ukrainian Relations in the Past and Today." He stressed the influence of Sts. Cyril and Methodius upon the development of the Ukrainian language and literature, and also the evolution of Ukrainian political thought.
