APOSTOLIC DELEGATE INSTALLS METROPOLITAN SENYSHYN IN PHILADELPHIA TWO UKRAINIAN CATHOLIC BISHOPS ARE CONSECRATED

PHILADELPHIA, Pa., October 26 (Special). — Bishop Ambrose Senyshyn, OSBM, Exarch of Stamford, was installed today as Archbishop Metropolitan for the Ukrainian Catholic Archeparchy (Archdiocese) of Philadelphia, and two Ukrainian Catholic bishops, Bishop Jaroslav Gabro and Bishop Augustine Eugene Hornyak, were consecrated for two Ukrainian dioceses—the one recently formed in Chicago, and the one in England and Wales, respectively.

The triple ceremony was performed by the Most Rev. Egidio Vagnozzi, Apostolic Delegate to the United States, representing Pope John XXIII, who made the three appointments on August 14, 1961. The services of installation and consecration, amidst Eastern Rite splendor and pageantry, took place at the Ukrainian Catholic Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception, on North Franklin Street.

Archbishop Metropolitan Ambrose Senyshyn, formerly Bishop of the Ukrainian Catholic Eparchy of Stamford, was installed as head of the Ukrainian Catholic Archeparchy, succeeding the late Metropolitan Constantine Bohachevsky, who died in January, 1961.

New Ukrainian Catholic Eparchy in Chicago

Bishop Jaroslav Gabro, formerly a pastor in Perth Amboy, N.J., is the second American-born Ukrainian Catholic Bishop elevated to the episcopal dignity. He will head the new Ukrainian Catholic Eparchy of Chicago, to embrace all states west of Ohio, previously in the Philadelphia Archeparchy.

Bishop Augustine Hornyak, born in Yugoslavia of Ukrainian parents, was formerly superior of St. Joseph's Monastery in Glen Cove, L.I. He will be Auxiliary to James Cardinal Godfrey of England and will serve over 20,000 Ukrainian Catholics who live in England and Wales.

Serving as co-consecrators were Bishop Joseph Schmondiuk, new head of the Ukrainian Catholic Eparchy of Stamford, and Bishop Isidore Boretsky, of Toronto's Ukrainian Catholic Eparchy. Archbishop John J. Krol represented the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Philadelphia at the ceremonies.

Solicitude of the Holy Father For Ukrainians

After the termination of the church ceremonies, a special banquet was held at the Sheraton Hotel, which several hundred honored guests attended, among them many Bishops, the clergy and representatives of central Ukrainian American organizations.

The principal speaker at the banquet was the Most Rev. Egidio Vagnozzi who congratulated the newly-installed Archbishop Metropolitan Senyshyn and the newly-consecrated Bishop Gabro and Bishop Hornyak. He said that His Holiness Pope John XXIII has long been associated with the Eastern Rite churches, especially during his appointments as Papal Nuncio in Bulgaria and Turkey. He further stressed that Pope John XXIII is keenly interested in the unity of all Christian churches, and he knows of the persecution and martyrdom of the Ukrainian Catholic Church behind the Iron Curtain. He repeated his Papal benediction to all those present and concluded:

"Let God bless you, your Bishops, and all your Ukrainian people so that they can soon become free and independent."

Other prelates who spoke at the banquet were Metropolitan Senyshyn, Bishops Gabro and Hornyak and Archbishop John J. Krol of Philadelphia. Bishop Joseph Schmondiuk was master of ceremonies and he addressed the guests in both English and Ukrainian.

Among some 31 Archbishops and Bishops of both the Roman Catholic and Byzantine Rites were Metropolitan Maxime Hermaniuk of Winnipeg, head of the Ukrainian Catholic Church in Canada, and Bishops Elko and Kocisko of the Pittsburgh Byzantine Rite Diocese.

"CHRIST IS OUR STRENGTH"

Dear Brethren in Christ:

Reflecting upon the significant growth of the Ukrainian Catholic Church in lands whereto its members have migrated, we, in deep humility and filial devotion, manifest our gratitude. We are grateful to Almighty God, to the Vicar of Christ Pope John XXIII, the Father of Christendom. We are grateful that in the midst of turbulent times all Christian men and women have been especially remembered. We are grateful that those Ukrainian Catholics who are scattered about the face of the earth because of the consequences of war, or of persecution, or of the lack of opportunity have been borne in mind in a singular manner.

Although the mighty of the free world appear to have forgotten our Ukrainian brethren, happily our spiritual Mother, the Holy Catholic Church, has not. Through the Vicars of Christ, the Popes of Rome, she has in the recent several years cared for the spiritual guidance of Ukrainian Catholics in Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Canada, England, France, Germany, Italy, Yugoslavia, and the United States of America. She has done this by creating new Ukrainian Archdioceses, eparchies, (dioceses), exarchies, apostolic vicariates; and by appointing for these ecclesiastical districts bishops who are sons of the Ukrainian Catholic Church and people. Recognizing these blessings, we cannot help but realize once again the oft-quoted truth that "Christ is our strength." For the benevolence bestowed upon us, let us give glory and thanksgiving to the Lord on High for ever and ever. To the Holy Apostolic See, let us

promise enduring allegiance, obedience and love.

The annals of our religious and national life in the United States of America are engraved with golden letters upon the hearts and minds of our people. They were imprinted by the acts, sacrifices and aspirations of our two hierarchs of blessed memory — The Most Reverend Bishop Soter Ortynsky, OSBM, and the Most Reverend Metropolitan-Archbishop Constantine Bohachevsky; of our pioneering members of the Clergy and the Laity. Memory serves to remind each one of us that the efforts of Their Excellencies, of our Priests, Sisters, and of our Faithful were blessed and crowned with successful achievements that culminated in the formation of the Ukrainian Catholic Metropolitan in the United States in the year 1958. The former Exarchy of Philadelphia became a Metropolis plus the Eparchy of Stamford in 1956, and now the Eparchy of Chicago under the spiritual leadership of Their Excellencies Bishop Joseph Schmondiuk and Bishop Jaroslav Gabro, respectively.

The time has come to begin a new chapter in the history of our religious and national life in our adopted land of the "stars and stripes." By God's will and with the blessing of our Holy Father Pope John XXIII, I have been designated—at the Ukrainian Catholic Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Philadelphia—to receive from the hands of His Excellency, The Most Reverend Archbishop Egidio Vagnozzi, Apostolic Delegate to the United States and Represent-

UCCA Inaugurates Pre-Convention Program of Action

NEW YORK, N.Y. (UCCA). At the monthly meeting of the Executive Board of the Ukrainian Congress Committee of America which took place on October 6, 1961, in New York City, Dr. Lev E. Dobriansky, Chairman of the UCCA, presented a 12-Point Program of activities for the coming year of 1962 for discussion and approval by the UCCA Executive Board. After a thorough and all-embracing discussion, the Program was adopted and approved. It was also unanimously decided that all UCCA Branches and Member Organizations be notified of the Program and begin implementing it as soon as possible.

The 12-Point Program of the activities of the UCCA encompasses the following:

- 1) An intensive fund drive for the purpose of collecting \$100,000 in the fiscal year of 1961-1962;
2) Consolidation and solidification of the UCCA by strengthening its apparatus and effective lines of communications between its Executive Board and its Branches and its Member Organizations throughout the country;
3) Continued campaign for the issuance of a "Shevchenko Champion of Liberty" stamp by the U.S. Government. In this campaign all UCCA Branches and Member Organizations, as well as individual members and contributors to the Ukrainian National Fund, are expected to play a far more active role than heretofore;
4) A sustained campaign by all UCCA Branches and Member Organizations for the implementation of H. Res. 211 (Floor Resolution calling for the establishment of a Special Committee on the Captive Nations in the House of Representatives);
5) Early planning of the Captive Nations Week celebrations in 1962 with a view toward having the vast participation of American organizations, public officials, press and TV support;

JERSEY CITY, N.J. — On Friday, Oct. 27, the Supreme Executive Committee of the Ukrainian National Ass'n held a regular meeting in the main UNA office presided over by Joseph Lesawyer, Supreme President of the UNA.

Other officers of the UNA taking part in the conference were the Supreme Vice-President Stephen Kuropas, Supreme Secretary Dr. Jaroslav Padoch, Supreme Treasurer Roman Slobodian and also the Editor-in-Chief of Svoboda, A. Dragan. Mrs. Anna Herman, the Supreme Vice-President, was not able to attend the meeting.

The main order of business at the meeting was the matter of new investments, especially mortgage loans in the United States and Canada, the business of the pre-convention organizational campaign and also publishing and administration problems.

The main subject of the conference was the organizational campaign, which in the last few months has brought the membership total to 80,000. Special awards, which will be presented to all those making better achievements in recruiting new members, were also discussed.

METROPOLITAN JOHN THEODOROVICH CELEBRATES 40TH ANNIVERSARY

On Sunday, November 5, the Cathedral Parish of Saint Vladimir's in Philadelphia will honor the spiritual leader of the Ukrainian Orthodox Church, His Eminence Metropolitan John, on his 40 years of archpastoral service to the Mother Church of Ukraine. His Eminence will celebrate Pontifical Divine Liturgy in the morning. At 4 P.M. many area clergy will participate in a Moleben Service to be conducted by His Grace, Archbishop Mstyslaw, President of the Consistory of the Ukrainian Orthodox Church of the U.S.A.

A large number of parishioners from neighboring churches will be in attendance. The Testimonial Banquet will be held at 6 P.M. at the catering establishment of "Four Chefs" Frankford Avenue and Levick Street. Among the invited guests are Governor Lawrence, U.S. Senator Hugh Scott, Mayor Dilworth and Stephen Kapeluck, President of the Ukrainian Orthodox League. His Eminence, the Most Reverend John Theodorovich, Metropolitan of the Ukrainian Orthodox Church of the United States of America, was born on October 6, 1887, in the village of Krypetz, province of Volhynia, Ukraine. He was born into a family which for many generations had given priests to the cause of God's Church.

After a preparatory course of studies in the Ecclesiastical School of Klevan, he received his final theological education in the Volhynia Theological Seminary in Zhytomir, the capital city of Volhynia Province. The order of Deacon was conferred upon him by Archbishop Eulogios, Volhynia Eparchy, on October 12, 1914. He was ordained into the priesthood by the Rt. Rev. Thaddeus, Archbishop of the city of Volodymyr Volynsky, on May 10, 1915.

During World War I he served as Chaplain of the Army and managed a unit of the Red Cross on the southwestern front. When the Ukrainian National Army was formed, His Eminence joined the movement and served the cause of the Ukrainian liberation in the army.

In 1950 the Sobor, in New York City, elected His Eminence to his present rank of Metropolitan, further uniting Ukrainian Orthodox parishes in the United States. Under his able leadership the Church has prospered and grown to 98 parishes, 120 clergy and 150,000 communicants. St. Vladimir's in Philadelphia has been his Cathedral for the last 29 years.

His Eminence, Metropolitan John, is the only survivor of the entire hierarchy of the Ukrainian Autocephalous Orthodox Church which had its re-emergence as the continuation of the Ukrainian native and traditional Church in liberated Ukraine in 1921. The 34 other hierarchs have been persecuted and executed by the Communist oppressors of Ukraine.

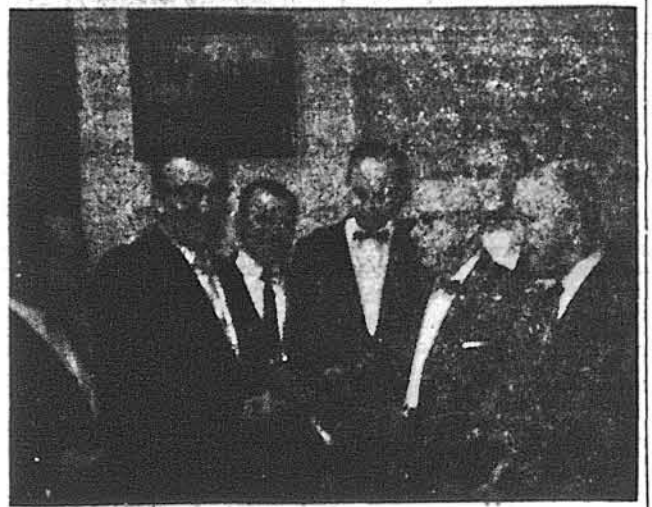
Ukraine Was First

NEW YORK, N.Y.—On October 17, 1961, the People-to-People Sports Committee, established by former President Dwight D. Eisenhower, held its fifth annual fund-raising "Dinner of Champions" at the Hotel Astor.

General Eisenhower established the program to facilitate contact among people of different nationalities in the interest of peace and mutual understanding. The program continues to enjoy the support of the Kennedy Administration.

In a letter to Colonel Edward P. F. Eagan, Chairman of the committee, President Kennedy said: "Your committee can and should make even greater contributions to two objectives which are of major national importance. First, to revive the traditional physical vigor, stamina and well-being of our citizens — especially of our younger citizens — by encouraging more American participation in international athletic competitions. Second, to expand friendship, goodwill and mutual understanding between the people of the United States and other nations of the world." President Kennedy also said that he was impressed by

FIFTH ANNIVERSARY OF HUNGARIAN REVOLUTION

On November 4, 1956, at 4 A.M., in the hour of dawn, Soviet tanks overwhelmed the sleeping city of Budapest. This happened four days after the representative of the Hungarian Revolutionary Government, Zoltan Tildy, and the representatives of the Soviet Government, Mikoyan and Suslov, had reached an agreement that the Soviet Government would withdraw its troops from Hungary and that Hungary would quit the Warsaw Pact.

The Soviet armies massacred 30,000 Hungarians, most of them young boys and girls. 75,000 people were deported and to this day only 12,000 have returned.

On the fifth anniversary of this bloody massacre we appeal to the people of the world to support our plea, that the Hungarians who were deported to the Soviet Union be returned to their country.

Only the power of public opinion and the moral support of the free world can bring about the release of the deported Hungarians, among which there are 7,000 girls who were

Jarema and Piznak Debate Issues Of Wagner-Lefkowitz Campaign

A two-hour debate ended on the same keynote as it began: "Judgment Day is November 7th for Messrs. Wagner and Lefkowitz." In the privacy of the election booths, the citizenry of New York City will decide whether the task of supervising the administration of the "Five Boroughs" will again be placed in the hands of the man who has directed it for upwards of eight years, or whether a new individual shall be chosen to assume the helm.

Late into last Friday evening, the 3rd floor of the Ukrainian Institute was crowded with people listening to a political forum in which Stephen J. Jarema served as the Democratic Standard Bearer and Michael Piznak, the Republican one. Charges and countercharges, indictments and rebuttals rang out as questions of "Bossism," "Scandals," "Housing" and "Taxation" were among the topics discussed. The tempo of the debate increased as the questioning from the audience became more pointed.

Mr. Jarema charged that the Republican-controlled Legislature was responsible for many of the deplorable conditions now prevalent within our City. Further, he asserted, that the attacks upon Mayor Wagner are evidence that his Honor had in fact provided forceful and effective leadership.

Mr. Piznak, with a mass of statistical material, indicted the Wagner Administration as being completely inept and irresponsible. He maintained that "the smoke screen of Bossism" is being employed by Mayor Wagner to conceal his own pitiful record.

Both speakers left the summations of their arguments to be found in the morning newspapers of November 8th, where they'll be printed with much more force and effect, together with the name of the newly elected Gracie Mansion occupant.

Mayor Wagner Held Nationality Press Conference

UKRAINIAN DEMOCRATS IN ATTENDANCE

NEW YORK, N.Y., October 25.—Mayor Robert F. Wagner, as well as his running mates Abe Beame and Paul Screevan, and the former Senator Herbert H. Lehman, attended a press conference for the nationalities press at the Overseas Press Club and explained the policy of the City Administration in regard to groups of foreign origin. Mr. Wagner said that the City of New York is the original "melting pot," where all races and creeds found freedom and opportunity to develop their individual and group interests. But today the term "melting pot" is no longer fashionable, as it is no longer desirable to be melted into one big lump; "it is better for each of us to retain his distinctive individual flavor, while also contributing to a common national flavor," Mr. Wagner stated.

He said that he was and will always be against any discrimination on account of a foreign origin, a different religion or race, and these guiding principles will always be observed by his Administration.

Mr. Lehman said that he started working with nationality groups long before he entered into public life, and he was always associated with immigration activities of one kind or another for over 50 years.

SUPERIORITY OF UNITED STATES

It is a known fact that the biggest lie told many times over is easily believed by those who are too readily convinced. It is also a known fact that healthy criticism, one of the strong points of western democracies, becomes sometimes self-degrading and tends to upgrade the values of the enemy — this is what communist propaganda stresses.

In the West at this time there is a tendency to upgrade the actual strength of the Soviet Union and international communism and to minimize the Western military, spiritual, economic and cultural superiority.

It was very fortunate that the assistant to the Secretary of Defense, Roswell L. Gilpatrick, and Secretary of State Dean Rusk, who spoke last weekend at two different forums, reaffirmed the strengths instead of the weaknesses of the United States.

In spite of the claims of Khrushchev, the development of world economy and spiritual progress is favorable to the free world and not communism with its two centers in Peiping and Moscow.

UNITED STATES, PEACE AND GERMANY

President Kennedy and West German Chancellor Conrad Adenauer again exchanged letters, and West German Ambassador to Washington, Dr. Wilhelm Greve, upon his return from a ten-day stay in Bonn, visited the White House and held a 50-minute conference with the President.

Meanwhile, Assistant Secretary of Defense Roswell L. Gilpatrick assured Germany's Defense Minister Strauss that the United States is fulfilling its program of rearming the West German army. According

to press reports, R. L. Gilpatrick said that the rumors that the United States discriminates against the West German army in favor of other members of NATO in the distribution of nuclear arms are completely untrue.

Today's situation is such that the question "to be or not to be" for the West is its reliance on NATO, which would fall apart if West Germany should withdraw from membership.

WAR AGAINST DIVERSION

All centers of international communist movement located in Moscow, Peiping, East Berlin, Prague, Warsaw, Budapest and lately also in Havana have not ceased to overflow the United States with communist agitation and propaganda literature. This literature not only propagates the ideas of communism but also is tied in, whether secretly or openly, with divisive actions to undermine current and legal state governments and the way of life in the free world.

The amount of communist literature being sent to the United States can be determined by the amount of mail and packages received from the Soviet Union by the post office department. In 1959, the amount reached 6,000,000 and in 1960 this number grew to 14,000,000. In 1961 after the restrictions were completely lifted the number grew about four or five times.

Special attention is given to the national groups in the United States by the people who fabricate this material. Each one of these national groups is looked after by a separate center in one of the cities in the communist bloc. The Ukrainian national group is a great favorite of these centers, and receives tons of all sorts of material from music sheets and films, even to specially prepared private letters.

Ukrainian Hunter Gets 1-ton Moose

HAMILTON, Ont., Oct. 19.—Gordon Bullock, a staff reporter on the Hamilton Spectator, reported that Harry Poworoznyk, a Canadian businessman of Ukrainian descent, used a gun for the first time in 43 years and returned home with a moose weighing about 1,900 lbs.

Mr. Poworoznyk, 66, toppled the "lord of the forest" with one bullet.

The last time he used a gun was in the First World War.

Mr. Poworoznyk, who is president of a city meat packing firm, Essex Packers Ltd., made the kill in the Moose River district on the seventh day out.

With him were eight other Hamilton hunters, all of whom returned with a moose.

The horns on Mr. Poworoznyk's moose measured 66 inches in diameter.

"How to use a gun soon came back to me," he said.

Weather for the ten-day hunting trip was good, except for two wet days.

Mr. Poworoznyk was one of the 16,000 "new" moose hunters expected this year in Ontario. More than 40,000 hunters are expected to receive licenses.
