PRE-CONVENTION U. N. A. MEMBERSHIP CAMPAIGN ATTAINS OUTSTANDING SUCCESS IN NOVEMBER

603 new members organized in November. UNA numbers over 80,500 members, 20 monthly champions. Five new members of Champions' Club, New branch of Carpatho-Ukrainians "Tysa" organized in New York. Ivan Skoeczylas obtains 44 members in Montreal, while Semen Lywytzky obtains 33 and Bohdan Zorych 28 in Toronto. Expect 1,200 members in December.

NEW JERSEY.—The Home Office of the UNA in Jersey City announced that the pre-convention UNA membership campaign exceeded all expectations. In October the UNA set a goal of 500 members for November and 1,000 for December. But November brought in 20% more than expected. The Soyuz "harvest" this month brought in 603 new members.

A comforting and promising feature of the November campaign is the total number of members reached by the UNA. While the Home Office announced in September that the UNA for the first time in its history exceeded 80,000 members, now this number exceeds 80,500 and there is every indication that this month the number will exceed 81,000.

It is a very hopeful sign for the future development of the greatest Ukrainian organization in the free world that the November campaign brought 20 monthly champions, that is, members who obtained 10 or more new members in this one month. They include first of all that "Big Trio" Ivan Skoeczylas, who obtained 44 members, Semen Lywytzky of Toronto with 33 members and Bohdan Zorych also of Toronto with 28 members. Every one who knows how much work and effort it takes to organize 30 to 50 new members must admire these achievements of our foremost organizers of the whole Soyuz. Besides these, the following organizers had much success in November: Dr. Wasyl Weresh of New York—15, John Malko of Baltimore—14, Michael Semkiw of Chicago—12, Peter Sylchak of Youngstown—12, Michael Turko of Ford City and Ivan Odezynsky of Philadelphia, both with 11, while those with 10 members were: Kwitka Steciuk of Jersey City, Stephen Hawrysh of Philadelphia, Dr. Atanas Slusarsczuk of Detroit, Anne Remick of Boston, Vladimir Kossar of Winnipeg, Volodymyr Zaparanik of Utica, V. Cymbala of Montreal, Wasyl Ostapiak of Toronto, John O. Flis, William Chupa and Walter Klawnik, all three of New York.

Along with these monthly champions it should be noted that during November five organizers were added to the Champions Club recently established by the UNA Executives. They are John Szydor of Astoria, Wasyl Mandzj of Yonkers, Michael Fedyszyn of Perth Amboy, Supreme Adviser Andrew Jula of Ambridge, and William Chupa of New York. Together with the recently named 28, the Champions Club now numbers 33 members. New members arrive every day. To become a member of this Club, one must obtain at least 25 new members this year. It can be expected that December will bring at least 20-25 new members. They will all be charter members of this honorary Club, which will exist on a permanent basis, will have its own officers and its own rights and privileges.

In mentioning these November winners, it should be brought out that the pre-convention campaign has now given us six leading organizers who this year have obtained more than 100 members. To this honorary "Extra Class" belong six organizers: Jifim Ormelchenko of Grimsby, Ont., Ivan Skoeczylas of Philadelphia, Michael Turko of Ford City, Nicholas B. Nichols of Chicago, Bohdan Zorych of Toronto and Semen Lywytzky of Toronto. As we can see there are three from the U.S. and three from Canada. The service of these six organizers in the development of the UNA can best be illustrated by the number of 719 members, whom they organized during this year. There is no doubt about it, this imposing figure will be considerably increased in December.

It is worthwhile also mentioning the large amounts for which our new members are insuring themselves. While a few years ago the most popular policy was for the sum of 500 dollars, it is now becoming almost obsolete. It can best be exemplified by Semen Lywytzky, who insured his 33 new members for the notable sum of 69,000 dollars.

A noteworthy achievement in the November campaign for the UNA and especially for New York is the organization this month of the new UNA Branch "Tysa," which aims at enrolling in its membership all Carpatho-Ukrainians scattered over America and Canada. Organizers of this Branch are the well-known Julian Revay, former Premier of the Carpatho-Ukrainian government, and Dr. Wasyl Weresh.

A special characteristic of this pre-convention campaign is the fact that active participation in it is being taken by the members of the UNA Home Office. In September they obtained eight members, in October 10, while in November they obtained 20, so far totaling 38 new members. It can be expected that this number will increase to around 50 in December.

The outstanding success of November campaign makes it actually possible to reach a new, very daring goal, which the UNA branches will set for themselves in this last month of the pre-convention campaign: 1,200 members! This number will permit the recouping of all losses, it will permit the UNA to reach and exceed 81,000 in membership and to end a completely successful campaign. Because of the coming 25th Jubilee Convention, which will be held in May 1962 in New York, this successful conclusion of the campaign will have a particular significance both as to the Convention itself and to the future of the UNA. Therefore the Executive of this Association believe that all Soyuz workers will make every effort to make their utmost contribution to the growth of Batko Soyuz, and that all Ukrainians who have not yet been insured in the UNA, or are insufficiently insured, will take the proper steps during December to greet the New Year with their future and the future of their families in proper order. UKRAINIAN LIFE IN FRANCE

(Special to THE UKRAINIAN WEEKLY)

PARIS, France. — The number of Ukrainians in France at the present time is rather difficult to ascertain, inasmuch as they have come in various waves of emigration and carried passports of at least four different states, which occupied the Ukrainian ethnographic lands. But approximate estimates indicate that the total number of Ukrainians in France may be as high as 35 to 40,000 persons. Over 2,000 of them live in Paris alone, while the rest are scattered in various industrial centers of France.

Despite this rather limited number, Ukrainian activities in France are second to none in Europe, and every opportunity is taken by our brothers and sisters in France to advance and promote the cause of Ukrainian liberation. Organizationally speaking, the Ukrainian community in France is roughly subdivided into four political groups, which, although not opposing each other, act individually and for their own purposes.

The Ukrainian National Unity is perhaps the oldest organization, or rather, it is a carry-over of the prewar Ukrainian National Union which was established in 1932 by Alexander Boykiv and Gen. Mykola Kapistiansky, its first president. In the past the organization had about 80 branches throughout France, which embraced Ukrainian workers who emigrated to France from the Ukrainian territories under Poland in the early 1920's. At the outbreak of World War II the Union had to fight all Polish efforts to mobilize Ukrainians into the Polish army, but eventually many Ukrainians were drafted into the French Foreign Legion and fought against the Nazis on various fronts. As a result of Polish instigations, the Union was dissolved by the French in 1948, and in its stead the present Ukrainian National Unity was established.

With the influx of new Ukrainian emigrants Ukrainian political and artistic life developed considerably, although not on the same level as in the United States or Canada. The Ukrainian National Unity has its own weekly newspaper "Ukrainske Slovo (La Parole Ukrainienne under the able editorship of O. Zhdanovych, and its own printing shop, where it publishes books and brochures. Every summer it has a course in the Ukrainian language, which some 80 young boys and girls take instruction in the Ukrainian language. It has a Ukrainian youth organization, which publishes a bulletin in the French language, and which has recently published "History of Ukraine by M. Hrushevsky in French."

The other large and very active Ukrainian organization is the OURF (Ob'ednannia Ukrainykykh Robitnykyv Frantsii—Union of Ukrainian Workers in France), which consists almost exclusively of post-war Ukrainian displaced persons. The important feature of this organization, headed by W. Popovych, is that it is an official member of the French Christian Trade Union organization, or syndicate, and as such enjoys the organizational support of the French labor movement and the same time of the French authorities. It has branches throughout France and engages in all sorts of Ukrainian cultural and political activities, under the circumstances allowed by existing conditions.

There is in Paris the old though small group of former members and adherents of the Ukrainian National Republic, which maintains the Simon Petlura Library and carries on political activities. A few Ukrainian intellectuals are engaged in the Ukrainian Christian Movement which is modeled on the Western European Christian Democratic movement, very popular in Western Europe at present.

Ukrainian social and community life received a strong impetus with the establishment of the Ukrainian Catholic Exarchate in Paris a few years ago. The new Ukrainian Catholic Bishop, the Most Rev. Volodymyr Malanchuk, is an Ordinary and works closely with Cardinal Felin of Paris. He is assisted by Chancellor Rev. Michel Levenets. The Ukrainian Catholic Parish and Church located at Boulevard St. Ger-

main, has over 1,000 parishioners, many of them belonging to the French-born generation. There is also a small Ukrainian Orthodox Church in Paris. Attempts are being made, at least on the leadership level, to establish a general Ukrainian representation in France, similar to the UCCA in the United States, or the Canadian Ukrainian Committee, which would represent the general Ukrainian interests in the French republic.

Outside Paris, in the suburb of Sarcelles there is located the Shevchenko Scientific Society under the direction of Prof. Volodymyr Kubiyovych, noted Ukrainian scholar and population expert, who with a few Ukrainian scholars, continues research work on Ukrainian history, demography and culture. A discussion, or rather interview, with Prof. Kubiyovych will be the feature of a special article.

On the whole Ukrainians in Paris and in France are faring fairly well and from the viewpoint of economic welfare they are on the same level as the French people. They live comfortably, although perhaps without the ultra-modern luxuries, such as cars, refrigerators or air-conditioning units in their homes. They try to promote the cause of Ukrainian liberation by whatever means are accessible to them. Two seemingly unsurmountable factors stand in their way in these particular types of activities: a) Russian influence in French life in general, especially in government circles and on the level of universities and scientific institutions; b) Communist agitation among Ukrainians and other Eastern European nationalities in France.

NY Ukrainians Topple Eintracht, 2-1

NEW YORK. — The New York Ukrainians gained another victory by defeating the Eintracht SC of New York, 2-1, last Sunday at the Eintracht Oval in Astoria in a German-American Soccer League match here.

Despite a very wet and soggy day more than 800 spectators showed up to see the Ukrainians play against the German team. The USC Eleven dominated play through most of the match and in the 39th minute outside left Archie Grant made a pass to inside left Ross who connected from 15 yards out into the lower left corner for a 1-0 count. Neither team was capable of scoring from then on and 8 minutes before the end of the game the referee, Huckle, called off the contest because of thick fog.

There is some doubt whether the Ukrainian Club will get its two points which it won fair and square, but the decision will be up to the German-American League officials. It should be pointed out, however, that the same conditions existed at the start of the second half and both teams had the same opportunity on the field. It should also be noted that according to soccer rules the referee should have walked out to the center of the field, and only then decide whether the conditions were bad, but he failed to do this. As it stands now the Ukrainians will have to replay the game at some future date.

The USC-Eintracht game was the only one played as the rest were postponed because of bad weather conditions. The Ukrainian Nationals were to play against the Brooklyn Italians in Philadelphia.

Nezowy Appointed to Hebrew Arts Council

William Nezowy, Jr., of Ukrainian descent a Catholic, residing in Ardmore, Pa., has been appointed to the Arts Council Board of the Young Men's and Young Women's Hebrew Association. The News of Dolaware County and Township News of Haverford, Pa., announced Mr. Nezowy's appointment. Nezowy is sales executive for Simmons Company, Philadelphia, Pa. He has been active in Ukrainian circles throughout north-eastern United States. Nezowy's daughter, Cindy, appeared in Ukrainian costume in 30 publications this year. Nezowy is the first Christian to be appointed to this executive board and will work on publicity for Arts Council. He will also review theatrical and art productions for future bookings at the Philadelphia YMYW-HA.

Recently, Nezowy was also appointed to the Jefferson House Citizens Committee for rebuilding and restoring the house where Thomas Jefferson wrote the Declaration of Independence. He is working with Philadelphia's most prominent citizens on this project. Several editorials have been devoted to this, also Senators Joseph S. Clark and Hugh Scott, have co-sponsored a bill to authorize federal action.

As soon as progress is made, Nezowy urges all Ukrainians and Ukrainian organizations to take interest and support this worthwhile and patriotic cause which will become part of the Independence National Historical Park.

It is further planned to display facsimiles of declarations of independence of all nations except the Soviet Union.
