Nationals Lose First of Two, 2-1

USC TROUNCES INTER-ITALIANS, 4-2

PHILADELPHIA.—The New York Hungarians forged ahead in the National Challenge Cup Eastern Finals when they defeated the Ukrainian Nationals of Philadelphia, 2-1, last Sunday at Houston Field before 3,000 fans.

The winning goal was scored four minutes after the restart of play by inside left Anton Domborotaki, a former Nats player, on a long azzling shot from some 25 yards out into the right corner of the net.

The teams will meet again next Sunday (April 29) in New York in the second match of the series. Total goal average will decide the winner and Eastern representative for the U.S. finals.

B. LEA GETS HAT TRICK Last Saturday (April 21) The New York Ukrainians downed the Brooklyn Inter-IItalians, 4-2, in an Inter-League match at the Ukrainian Field, Astoria.

A hat-trick by inside-left Billy Lea sparked the New York Ukrainians to their high victory. Lea scored twice in the first half and once in the second half. The fourth and final goal was made by outside-right Walter Cyszowych on a penalty kick.

The Ukrainians had it pretty much their own way throughout the match. They were superior in short passing and faster in the start to the ball. The Italian team scored both of its goals in the second half, one of them on a disputed penalty kick.

The Chicago Kickers defeated the Chicago Eagles 2-1 last Sunday and won the right to represent the state of Illinois in the National Challenge Cup competition.

The two teams were tied at the end of the regulation time. Outside right Joe Mueller headed the winning goal into the Eagles' net with five minutes gone in the second overtime period.

Canadian Soccer fans will not be able to see Britain's football "maestro" Stanley Matthews in action this summer. The English league will not allow its players to take part in competitive soccer overseas.

Nearly 128,000 fans turned out to see the Scottish Rangers defeat St. Mirren, 2-0, and win the Scottish Cup last Sunday at Hampden Park in Glasgow.

Brazilian Flamengo Soccer team of Rio De Janeiro defeated Palermo of Italy, 3-1, in an exhibition match.

Argentina's world cup selection "A" team defeated Prussia Munster, 2-1, in the German soccer team's first game on its exhibition tour of Argentina.

Czechoslovakia's National Soccer team defeated Flamengo of Brazil, 4-2. Four days later the game Czech team defeated Uruguay, 3-1, both games being played as a warm-up for World Championship games in Chile.
