To provide for the creation of a captive nations freedom series of postage stamps in honor of national heroes of freedom, commencing with a Taras Shevchenko freedom stamp.

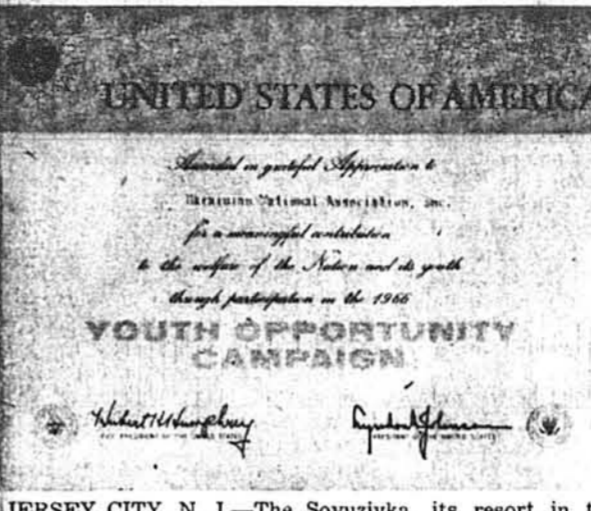

Oleh B. Koropey, Second Lieutenant of the U.S. Army, was awarded the Bronze Star Medal with V Device "for heroism in connection with military operations against a hostile force" in Viet Nam.

Although bleeding profusely and in intense pain, he assisted in loading the dead and wounded. Lt. Koropey's quick action in this evacuation to the battalion aid station saved the lives of an army of Vietnamese soldiers.

'Miserably Cold'

"There was a little bit of snow on the ground, and it was miserably cold," recalled Kostecki in an interview in his office—a world away and nearly a generation later.

Weight Drops Off

Then an unknown lieutenant colonel, Johnson normally carried 170 pounds on a six-foot frame. At Fukuoka, Kostecki recalls, the future general weighed less than 100 pounds and was flat on his back.

Some 50 Died

Some 50 men in the Johnson group died at Fukuoka. The rest were moved to Korea in April, but Kostecki remained behind with the sick. He and Johnson were liberated in different countries after the Japanese surrender that summer.

'Doctor of the Century'

"These two are probably the most exciting pair in the game today," said Magnozzi, head of the New York Inter Soccer Club.

Eusebio is backed up by such soccer giants as Simoes, Augusto and Torres. All of these players were members of the national team that competed in England.

The greek team made an appearance in New York two years ago. It was led by a 24-year-old center forward, Demetrios Papaionnou.
