EXPANDED SOCIAL SERVICES SOUGHT BY UUARC

COMMITTEE CALLS FOR INCREASED CHARITABLE, SOCIAL ACTIVITIES

PHILADELPHIA, Pa.—The need for expanded social services and increased charitable activity among Ukrainians here and in other countries of the free world was stressed by members of the Executive Board of the United Ukrainian American Relief Committee at its meeting here Saturday, September 23.

Problem for World Congress

The question, one of the most burning though generally unrecognized in the Ukrainian community, according to the UUAARC board, will be raised at the World Congress of Free Ukrainians convening in New York in November of this year.

Dr. Walter Gallan, UUAARC President, said that a network of Social Service branches could be organized nationally within the framework of the Relief Committee, but that active participation on the part of the entire community is needed.

He said that the activity of the Philadelphia Social Service, which handled 230 cases alone, points up the need for similar organizations in every major center of Ukrainian life.

The UUAARC, the only internationally recognized Ukrainian relief organization, could provide the basis for such charitable community service, Dr. Gallan stressed, but the community's solid support would be needed to make it operational.

UNA President's Report

The recent trip of UNA's Supreme President Joseph Lesawyer to Europe confirmed both the possibilities and the need for assistance to Ukrainians living on the continent.

Mr. Lesawyer was not present at the meeting because he was attending the National Fraternal Congress in Florida. His written report, however, as well as additional information were presented by Anthony Dragan, editor-in-chief of Svoboda.

SENIOR CITIZENS PROJECT GOING UP IN PHILADELPHIA

ASCENSION MANOR IS SPONSORED BY UKRAINIAN CATHOLIC ARCHDIOCESE

PHILADELPHIA, Pa. — A widespread need for good, safe and attractive housing for senior citizens prompted the Ukrainian Catholic Diocese of Philadelphia under the leadership of Archbishop-Metropolitan Ambrose Senyshyn to institute a non-profit corporation known as Ascension Manor to look after the senior citizens within the Archdiocese.

A new eight-story apartment building with 141 apartments is now under construction.

Independent Living

The purpose of the Manor is to provide independent living citizens 62 years and over with housing and related facilities specially designed to meet their physical, social and psychological needs and to contribute to their health, security, happiness and usefulness in longer living on a non-profit basis.

The entire area bounded by Franklin and Seventh streets is under complete renewal now. The new Ukrainian Catholic Cathedral of Immaculate Conception is just one-half block south of the Manor.

Also near the new apartment building are stores, restaurants, a theater and other neighborhood services.

The building has been planned to allow maximum space for each apartment with a

fine view of more than three acres park-like surroundings. The modern kitchens are equipped with refrigerators and gas ranges. The all-tile bathrooms have built-in hand grips.

Modern Utilities

The entire ground floor of the Manor is devoted to a large community room, management office, maintenance and storage areas. A hobby center, medical and social-welfare office are also on the ground floor. Health services will be available within the building and at the nearby St. Luke's Hospital.

Rents, including all utilities, for efficiency and one-bedroom apartments vary from \$84.00 to \$104.00 monthly. Rents are based on a non-profit operation, in carrying out

legislation first passed in 1959. Therefore, as costs decline, so will the rents.

Opportunity

For those who cannot afford the entire rent, but otherwise qualify, a special assistance fund is being established along with application for a rent supplement from the Department of Housing and Urban Development.

It is expected that a large number of Ukrainians will avail themselves of the opportunity to live in this modern apartment building. The area was once the hub of Ukrainian activity. Although many persons have moved out to other sections of the city and suburbs, the organizational life still centers around the Franklin Street area.

UNA EXECUTIVES ATTEND NATIONAL FRATERNAL CONGRESS SESSION

PRESIDENT JOHNSON HOSTS DELEGATES AT WHITE HOUSE; GOV. HUGHES IS GUEST SPEAKER

HOLLYWOOD, Fla.—Three Supreme Officers of the Ukrainian National Association took part in the four-day annual meeting of the National Fraternal Congress here September 24-27.

Joseph Lesawyer, President, Dr. Jaroslav Padoch, Secretary, and John Kokolski, Treasurer, represented the UNA at the meeting, attended by several hundred delegates from 78 fraternal benefit societies and 28 fraternal state congresses.

Powerful Organization

The National Fraternal Congress of America includes 101 fraternal associations in 28 states and two Canadian provinces. It has in excess of 90 per cent of the total insurance in force, assets and membership of the entire fraternal benefit system.

Ukrainian Attorney's Bid to Free American Nears Success

NEW YORK, N. Y. — Attorney Peter Krehel, of Sunbury, Pa., may have scored another success in releasing an American citizen from a Communist country.

She is Mrs. Suzanne Herczeg, a former American citizen, who has been trying to leave Communist Hungary since her husband died in jail there.

Flies Back

Mr. Krehel, who argued for her release in Budapest in August, 1966, received a letter two weeks ago in which Mrs. Herczeg told of getting her travel documents from the Communist authorities and of arrangements for her flight to the United States "as soon as possible."

Mrs. Herczeg last lived in Cudahy, Wis., her hometown, in 1933. She went to Hungary on a visit to her parents, and married a Hungarian businessman and bore him a son.

The Communists confiscated their flour mill and jailed her husband as a capitalist. He died in prison.

Attorney Krehel, who is of Ukrainian descent, was asked by family members and friends of Mrs. Herczeg to try to gain her release from Hungary. He and his wife Eleanor were in the Hungarian capital in 1966 and discussed the situation with her personally.

Conference Stresses Battle Against Communism

PLANS SET FOR ANNUAL MEETING IN ARLINGTON

WASHINGTON, D. C. — The All-American Conference to Combat Communism, a nationally-representative organization with some 40 million combined membership, will hold its annual meeting on Friday and Saturday, November 3 and 4, at the Marriott Twin Bridge Hotel in Arlington, Va.

He urged member organizations of the All-American Conference to send representatives for a day or two of training at the Freedom Center sometimes during the month of October, 1967.

The agenda of the annual meeting calls for a series of outstanding speakers and specialists on communism.

One of them will be Dr. Dobriansky, who will discuss the oppression of the non-Russian nations in the USSR.

Other speakers will dwell on the state of religion, social and economic conditions and the national and cultural genocide perpetrated by Russian Communists upon the captive nations.

Expose Fraud

The pre-convention meeting of the All-American Conference discussed taking an ad in The New York Times, which should be placed in the first week of November, and should rebuff the claims of the Kremlin masters that the Bolshevik revolution fifty years ago had brought a "socialist millennium" to the peoples of the USSR.

Other points in the ad will express the Conference's support of U.S. forces in Viet Nam and denounce Russian Communist machinations in the Middle East.

Ukrainians from the metropolitan area of Washington, especially members of UCCA branches in Washington and Baltimore should take part in the Conference and in its business luncheon and banquet, to be held at noon and in the evening on Friday, November 3.
