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Loss of a Patriot, Christian, Scholar

In the evening of Sunday, April 27, Dr. Roman Smal-Stocki died at Georgetown University Hospital in Washington, D. C. He passed away quietly. The last to visit him and to receive his courageous "thanks" and "good-by" were the Very Rev. Constantine Berdar, Rev. M. Makukh, Rev. Meletius Wojnar, Dr. Bohdan Skaskiw, and the UCCA President. With extraordinary strength of mind and moral fortitude to the last, one of Ukraine's greatest sons extended his arms to clasp the hand of each, then faintly uttered his final expression of friendship, and lapsed into a coma preceding his death.

These final moments typified the genuine greatness and towering stature of the man. For Ukrainians in particular, but for all free men in general, the death of Dr. Smal-Stocki is a grave loss to the ceaseless cause of freedom. It is truly the grave loss of a patriot, Christian, and scholar. Selflessly and with unparalleled devotion, he dedicated his entire and long adult life to the cause of a free and independent Ukraine and later, through it, to the preservation of the freedom and security of his America. Personal glory, money, even the advantages of a marital existence were alien considerations to his unique and priceless dedication. Through all the stages of his rich and varied life — as a student, an ambassador, a professor, an author, an intellectual leader, and a staunch defender of the Faith — he was wedded to the vital and promising cause of a free Ukraine. Prof. Smal-Stocki Buried in New Pennsylvania Cemetery

PHILADELPHIA, Pa. — On Wednesday, April 30, 1969, Prof. Roman Smal-Stocki, president of the Shevchenko Scientific Society and outstanding Ukrainian scholar who died on Sunday, April 27, 1969 at the Georgetown University Hospital, was buried in the new Ukrainian Catholic Cemetery in Langhorne, Pa. in a modest ceremony, according to his last wishes.

Some 80 representatives of the Ukrainian American central organizations took part in the funeral services.

The funeral Mass or "panashyda," at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Philadelphia was officiated by the Most Rev. Ambrose Senyshyn, Archbishop and Metropolitan of the Ukrainian Catholic Church in the United States, assisted by the Very Rev. Msgr. Emil Manastersky, Vicar General of the Ukrainian Catholic Diocese of Stamford, the Very Rev. Msgr. Vasyl Makukh, Rector of the Ukrainian Catholic Seminary in Washington, the Very Rev. Msgr. Myroslav Charyna and the Very Rev. Msgr. Basil Losten. Msgr. Charyna also read a letter, written on April 20, 1969, by the late Professor Smal-Stocki to Metropolitan Senyshyn, in which the late Ukrainian scholar expressed his last wishes as to his funeral. Accordingly, there were no eulogies during the funeral services.

Ukrainian GOP Leaders Form Federation

DOBRIANSKY PLEDGES FULL SUPPORT

CLEVELAND, O. — Ukrainian state chairmen from nine key states met in Cleveland, O., on May 3-4 for the purpose of forming a national federation of Ukrainian state Republican organizations.

According to the newly adopted constitution, one of the principal aims of the Federation is "to encourage and assist Ukrainian Americans to greater participation within the Republican Party and to seek commensurate recognition."

Dr. Lev E. Dobriansky, titular head of Ukrainian GOP activity, could not be present at the conclave but sent a letter in which he emphasized the historical significance of the conference, reiterated his "complete support for the undertaking," and added that the Federation's "operations will receive every measure of feasible coordination with the Republican plans and operations," in Washington.

Dr. Dobriansky was named honorary president of the Federation.

A letter from Rep. Rogers Morton, Chairman of the Republican National Committee, was also received requesting that he be informed of all decisions reached at the organizational conference.

Invitational letters were sent to all 22 Ukrainian state chairmen appointed by Dr. Dobriansky to work in the Ukrainian section of Nixon-Agnew Citizens Committee during the last campaign. Eleven state chairmen could not attend personally but either sent representatives or voted by certified proxy. Representing Mr. Walter Anastas of Minnesota were Dr. and Mrs. Serhij Yermolenko. Fully supporting all decisions reached at the Cleveland

Unanimously elected to three year terms on the Executive Committee of the Ukrainian National Republican Federation (UNRF) were: Myron B. Kuropas, president; Peter Puclo, first vice-president; Mrs. Mary Dushnyck, second vice-president; Walter T. Darmopray, secretary; Taras Szmagala, treasurer.

After the conference, Mr. Kuropas, newly elected UNRF president, stated: "This meeting reaffirmed our belief in the American constitution

and strengthened our resolve to protect those precious rights and liberties which all Ukrainian Americans living in this wonderful country of ours currently enjoy. At the same time, we have not forgotten Ukraine, the land of our ethnic origin, which today does not enjoy the right of national self-determination. We are convinced that our continued active and dedicated support of the American political process will not only demonstrate our loyal commitment to American ideals but will serve as a beacon of hope for those who are now suffering under oppressive regimes, not only in Ukraine, but in other lands as well."

Ethnic Power: Neglected Nationalities

The article, written by Monroe W. Karmin, is a timely reminder of a latent force which has heretofore received little recognition, politically or otherwise...

Like the black community in the United States, the ethnic groups are confronted with the same social and economic ills: lack of adequate housing, job and education aid...

Now that President de Gaulle of France has resigned following a national referendum, it is extremely important to watch what tactics will Moscow use in Europe in the near future.

The basic situation as Moscow views it, has changed and will change very little. What then are the basic strategies? Moscow is determined by whatever means are possible to pulverize NATO and to separate, and force out United States participation in the defense of the free world...

There is the hostility in Denmark and other countries to the present military regime in Greece, which is being fostered abroad by Andreas Papandreu, a former naturalized American citizen...

Yet Moscow has other devices to carry out its main purpose. Within the last few weeks it has issued a call for a general peace conference between the nations of the Warsaw Pact and NATO...

Many Devices at Hand

Then, as apparent afterthoughts to its proposals for demilitarizing the seabed, Moscow makes it clear in connection with proposals for the control of nuclear missiles that no country station them outside its own boundaries...

Furthermore, in opening the discussion on the controversial article mentioned above, we expressly stated in the NEW STAR (NO. 218) of March 30, 1969, the following: "The views of the author in no way reflect the views of the editors of the NEW STAR nor the position of the management and hierarchy, who in many instances strongly disagree with the expressed views."

In our reply to the question "why," we do not intend to analyze the proposition of our various discussants — it is for our readers to analyze, compare, and arrive at a final crystallization of their own opinions, each according to his own convictions.

The distinguished contributors who added their voices to the discussion exhibited a deep concern for the issues raised, at times in a somewhat drastic manner, in this article. By virtues of their pertinent, astute, and dispassionate remarks, seasoned by their concern, an appropriate intellectual level was preserved throughout the discussion. It must be added that every one of the discussants demonstrated his sincerity and goodwill.

As we have emphasized before — and point out again — only through a free exchange of ideas, through a dialogue conducted with a respect for differing opinions, with mutual love, understanding, and good-will, can we ever achieve a true awareness of the issues gnawing at our religious and national consciences and so arrive at a true synthesis of ideas that would work toward the strengthening of our Church and our national group.

It was also under this aspect of goodwill, coupled with a sincere desire to initiate a discussion of today's pressing problems of our Ukrainian Catholic Church and our Ukrainian society in the Free World, that the editors of the NEW STAR permitted the publication of this specific article.

Pope John XXIII spoke of the freedom of expression when he stated that there should be unity within the Church regarding dogmatic and moral issues, yet in other matters he urged freedom and mutual dialogue governed by the principles of Christian love. One of our popular Ukrainian newspapers in America recently editorialized: "The American democratic system permits liberty of thought and word not only in theory but in practice as well."

Jarošlav Gabro, on the occasion of many public appearances and in many of his Pastoral Letters gave evidence of great concern for the necessity of cultivating and preserving of Ukrainian tradition, language and culture. And, therefore, the assertions of the author of "No Idle Prattle" are not in harmony with the statements of the Bishop.

In permitting the publication of "No Idle Prattle," we were guided by the above stated principles of free speech and the desire to enliven the much needed dialogue in this post-conciliar era. We believe our readers will accept this clarification in the same spirit of sincerity as it is being offered.

I do all things, for the sake of the gospel, that I may be made partaker thereof." (1 Cor. 9. 22-24)
