PHILADELPHIA WILL BE SITE OF UCCA ANNIVERSARY OBSERVANCE

PRESIDENT NIXON'S POLICIES IN SOUTHEAST ASIA SUPPORTED; UCCA EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETS

NEW YORK, N.Y. (UCCA Special). — The 30th anniversary of the founding of the UCCA will be observed this fall in Philadelphia, Pa., according to a decision taken at the meeting of the UCCA Executive Committee, held Friday, May 1, in New York City.

It is planned to hold a special ceremony at Independence Hall during the day and an anniversary banquet in the evening. The date will be announced shortly. The Executive Board also recommended that special programs, such as banquets, rallies and other events be held in other Ukrainian communities on that occasion.

Report on Relief

Dr. Walter Gallan, UUAARC President, reported on his recent visit to Yugoslavia, where he conferred with Archbishop Gabriel Bukatko and a number of U.S. Embassy and local Yugoslav officials.

Mr. Bazarko stated that over 1,000 copies of "Lenin: Originator of Communist Terror and Genocide" were distributed. The UNESCO Office requested additional copies of the memorandum, and 100 extra copies were sent upon request to U.S. Senators and Congressmen.

Work on Resolution

He stated further that a number of U.S. Congressmen are working on the draft of a resolution on Ukraine's independence anniversary, and that the Congressional resolution on ethnic studies is in progress.

Dr. Dobriansky said that out of 56 applicants for the courses at the Institute of Comparative Political and Economic Systems at Georgetown University only one was of Ukrainian descent, which was rather disappointing. He also suggested that the UCCA branch in Washington be charged with care-taking of the Shevchenko monument.

Hnytzkyj Elected President Of N.Y.C. Student Hromada

NEW YORK, N.Y. — The annual election of the New York Ukrainian Student Hromada, Inc., were held here Friday, May 1, in NYU's Loeb Student Center. The meeting drew a record attendance of nearly 170 Hromada members who witnessed one of the most exciting and strongly contested elections in the Hromada's history. The winner was Oleh Hnytzkyj who defeated his opponent, Lev Chirovsky, by a margin of 79 to 37.

IN YUGOSLAVIA UUAARC PLANS TWO SCHOOLS, CENTER FOR UKRAINIANS

PHILADELPHIA, Pa. — The United Ukrainian American Relief Committee, moving into the second phase of the relief effort for Ukrainian earthquake victims in Yugoslavia, announced plans to build two schools and a community center in the area most heavily damaged by last year's quake.

The plans were announced at a UUAARC meeting last Saturday in Philadelphia, which also included a full report by Dr. Walter Gallan, the relief organization's president who returned recently from a trip to Yugoslavia.

Met with Officials

Dr. Gallan said that he met with Yugoslav officials in Belgrade and Banja Luka, as well as the American officials in Washington and in Yugoslavia, to discuss the various aspects of the relief effort.

The UUAARC president stated that the Yugoslav authorities appreciate the assistance rendered so far by the UUAARC in channeling relief from the U.S. and Canada to the Ukrainian victims in and around Banja Luka. Thanks to this effort, said Dr. Gallan, the immediate needs of the victims have been met.

The city authorities in Banja Luka and the Yugoslav Red Cross officials have promised to open an office for the UUAARC in the city.

Ballet Premiere Nears

NEW YORK, N.Y. — "Kvit Paporoti" (Magic Flower), a ballet based on stylized folk dances combined with the Feast of Ivan Kupalo, by ballerina-choreographer Roma Pryma-Bohachevsky, will premiere on Sunday, May 24, at the Brooklyn Academy of Music.

The plans call for the construction of two buildings, one in the village of Desiatyn, the other in Lishnia, which would house two-grade schools. The children now have to walk several miles to attend classes in the neighboring villages.

The community center would be built in Prnjavor, a larger village in the stricken area. The center would serve the Ukrainians who constitute the majority of the population in the area.

GOP Club in Philadelphia Hears Michael Kitsock

ODEZYNSKY IS RE-ELECTED PRESIDENT PHILADELPHIA, Pa. — Michael Kitsock, the man who stands a good chance of becoming the first Congressman of Ukrainian descent in this country, was the guest speaker at the annual meeting of the Ukrainian Republican Club here Sunday, April 19.

Mr. Kitsock, who was given a standing ovation by some 300 members that took part in the meeting, imparted some of his political views to the gathering and spoke of the reasons which prompted him to run for Congress.

Endorsed

The 45-year-old candidate, who was reared in the home of Ukrainian immigrants, was unanimously endorsed for Congress by the Republican executive committees of Schuylkill and Berks counties.

Early opinion polls indicate that he has an excellent chance of winning the congressional seat from Pennsylvania's sixth district in the November election.

The meeting, in response to an appeal of the Club's executive committee, made a substantial contribution to Mr. Kitsock's campaign fund.

ASST. SECRETARY ROSSIDES TO SPEAK AT UNA CONVENTION BANQUET

WASHINGTON, D. C. — Eugene T. Rossides, Assistant Secretary of the Treasury, will be the principal guest speaker at the UNA convention banquet Thursday, May 21, at the Statler Hilton Hotel in Cleveland, O.

As Assistant Secretary of the Treasury for Enforcement and Operations, Mr. Rossides' responsibilities include direct supervision of the Bureau of Customs, the U.S. Secret Service, the Bureau of the Mint, the Bureau of Engraving and Printing, and the Treasury Law Enforcement School.

Mr. Rossides, who is of Greek ancestry, serves as the principal law enforcement policy advisor to the Secretary of the Treasury. His responsibilities include providing policy guidance for all Treasury law enforcement activities, including those of the Internal Revenue Service.

Mr. Rossides served as a criminal law investigator in the Rackets Bureau on the staff of New York County District Attorney Frank S. Hogan.

For two years, Mr. Rossides was an Assistant Attorney General for the state of New York, having been appointed by the then Attorney General, Jacob K. Javits, who assign-

IN NEW JERSEY Worobec, Zwier Step Up Drive On Eve of May 12th Election

NEWARK, N.J. — B. George Worobec and Stanley Zwier, both candidates for councilmen-at-large in New Jersey's May 12th election, are stepping up their campaigns and personal appearances in an effort to marshal support.

Mr. Worobec, the young Ukrainian educator, is making his initial bid for elective office. He is seeking the councilman-at-large seat in Irvington, N.J., the city with a large Ukrainian population which is expected to vote heavily for the candidate next Tuesday.

Mr. Zwier, former mayor of Clifton, N.J., is also seeking the office of councilman-at-large. A hard and seasoned campaigner, Mr. Zwier is a former member of the Democratic Party's National Committee and one of the most popular mayors of Clifton.

Both candidates are active members of their respective communities and both enjoy popularity among Ukrainian Americans.

UAV to Place Plaque at Arlington National Cemetery

WASHINGTON, D.C. — A group of Ukrainian American Veterans, led by National Commander William M. D. Betz, presented a Memorial Plaque at Arlington National Cemetery and placed a wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier here Friday, April 24, in what was a moving tribute to the men who died in defense of freedom and democracy.

As the rain fell and the strains of taps flowed over the grounds of this the greatest of all American Memorials, the Ukrainian American Veterans saluted the fallen comrades-in-arms who fought on battlefields around the globe in defense of human rights and liberty.

The presentation of the UAV memorial plaque at Arlington National Cemetery is the culmination of five years of hard work. First, the design had to be made, then approved by the Department of the Army, and finally it had to be cast in bronze. Additional formalities had to be dealt with to secure permission for the presentation.
