The initial success encouraged the members of the group and their parents to retain it. Under the directorship of first Peter Karkoc and, in recent years, that of Mrs. Lucy Karkoc, the group has expanded to over 20 members coming from Hibbing, Chisholm, and Virginia, Minnesota, all young children and teenagers, many of mixed national backgrounds, some third generation Americans.
